Investing in your gas supply Erskine Bridge project Noise control







St Patrick's RC Church

Work has begun preparing the area behind St Patrick's RC Church ahead of the construction of the new pipeline across the River Clyde, which includes clearing the area and setting up a small site compound with offices and storage.

The Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD) is due to begin at the end of May. Prior to this, a sleeve will be installed to support the drill entry. The work to install the sleeve will unavoidably generate some noise and we have been working closely with our contractor, J Murphy & Sons Ltd to reduce the level of disturbance as much as possible.

To minimise noise pollution, a barrier will be erected around the perimeter of the working area to form a physical barrier between the work site and the residences on Lusset Road and St Patrick's RC Church Presbytery to deflect noise upwards, away from the properties. In addition, acoustic barriers will be placed in close proximity around the equipment to abate the noise further. Noise levels will be checked throughout the project by both SGN and the contractor.



The installation of the sleeve and the HDD will be carried out Monday to Friday between the hours of 8am and 6pm, and not during daily mass or other church services. Some work may be required at the weekend, between these hours. Following the HDD, the operation to pull in the pipeline requires 24 hour working.

Depending on the actual conditions encountered, the installation of the sleeve is likely to take around one month to install, with a further two and a half months for the HDD.

During this period, the shaft for the crossing below Kilpatrick Railway Station will also be prepared. This work will also take place Monday to Friday between the hours of 8am and 6pm, although some work may be required at the weekend, between these hours. The installation of the tunnel below the station may require 24 hour working.

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Lusset Park

Lusset Park will be closed from 16 April 2018 for the construction of the new pipeline. After the site is set up and prepared, as with the work behind St Patrick's RC Church, work will begin to construct the shaft for the tunnel below Kilpatrick Railway Station.



This is due to take place in June and July. This work will also take place Monday to Friday between the hours of 8am and 6pm, although some work may be required at the weekend, between these hours.

The installation of the tunnel below the station may require 24 hour working. The construction of the shaft is due to be carried out in June and the tunnelling programmed for July and August. Once again, every effort will be made to minimise noise pollution by ourselves and our contractor.
