Lusset Park path and parking re-opens

In our last newsletter, we were able to report that our pipeline across the railway station at Kilpatrick Station was complete. We have now reached another milestone with the re-opening of the path and parking at Lusset Park. The ground has now been reinstated. the road has been tarmacked, power and water have been restored to the changing rooms and the football pitch re-turfed with new goalposts erected.

We still need access to carry out some further operations work, but this is only a small area and will not impact on matches or on parking.

The temporary car park we provided on Braes Road remained open over the Easter Weekend but was closed permanently to members of the public from Tuesday, 23 April.

We'd really like to thank everyone for their patience while the work was ongoing and hope the temporary parking on Braes Road helped lessen any inconvenience.

Putting things back Mar Hall

We always aim to reduce our environmental impact and ensure we restore the areas of our construction work to at least its original standard, if not better. For example, land owned by Mar Hall which was used as a work area for the pipeline construction was handed back some time ago, but re-seeding of the land could not be done until the spring. This has now been carried out and the difference can be seen already. To help improve security we also added an additional 130 metres of fencing.

Boden Boo

Land within Boden Boo community woodland has also been reinstated. As we agreed with Forestry & Land Scotland (FLS) any felled trees will be replanted with native species. This will be carried out by FLS at an appropriate time. The upgraded footpaths which were installed diverting walkers around our work area have had some chicanes added and these will be staying as a permanent feature.

Although we still have a significant amount of work to carry out in this area, we have been able to re-open the permanent paths to members of the public.

A bug hotel has been built using reclaimed site waste and other natural materials including damaged wooden pallets, hessian sack, twigs, broken pottery, bamboo leaves, moss and bark.

Built by Chris Hamill, David Oswell and Andrew Wilkinson, it's sited at Our Lady of Loretto's outdoor classroom within The Saltings. A smaller bug 'guesthouse' has been sited at the school, with a third hotel at the Nursery Times by the River in Clydebank.

Wood from felled trees was previously donated for the outdoor classroom.

Claire Waddell, Headteacher at Our Lady of Loretto school commented: "I didn't realise it was going to be a five-star establishment. Our thanks to all who donated material and built the hotels."
